Club

I joined the Lions Club of Reading in 2008 and have served as Tail Twister, Fund Raiser, Vice President and President (2011) and I am currently Lion President second time around.

District

In 2012 I was appointed Zone Chair and in 2013 Regional Chair for Zone 5M. In 2014 I was appointed Centennial Chair and Sergeant at Arms for District 105D, roles which I fulfilled for 4 years. During this time, I was also deputy and Chair of Convention for 4 different District Governors. In July 2018 I was appointed MD officer and in July 2019 I was appointed District 105SC Officer for Prostate Cancer.

Other Lions experience

I completed the Emerging Lions Institute course (2010) and the Guiding Lions training (2012).

In 2014 I attended my first International Convention in Canada and was co-opted onto the British Isles organising committee by PCC Lions Philip Goodier and PDG Lion David Firth. In February 2018 I attended Buckingham Palace Lions Centennial Celebration hosted by HRH Countess of Wessex.

I have also made International Lions friends along the way, my wife and I love the island of Malta and have made lovely friends from the 5 Maltese Lions Clubs - each year we try and coincide a holiday with one of their Charters and have met Lions there from Italy, Sicily, Belgium and France.

During my Lions service I have been awarded several certificates of appreciation. In 2018 I was very honoured to receive the International Presidents Award from PID Lion Kenneth Persson and also in 2019 I was very proud to receive the Melvin Jones Fellowship Award.

I joined Thames Valley Police in 1975 as a Police Cadet aged 16 and retired in 2007 as a Sergeant after 32 years. I then became Office Manager in the Scenes of Crime Department where I remain - 44 years later!

I am a keen cyclist and having had Prostate Cancer myself in 2017 (picked up by a Lions PSA testing day), I got a team together with my eldest nephew and rode the Prudential Ride London Cycle Ride in August 2019, where the team raised £12,036.78 for Prostate Cancer UK. I have always enjoyed fund raising and giving something back to the community; I previously organised and rode in a team raising over £26,000 riding from Land's End to John O'Groats in 1997 in memory of Annie's Dad, I also did another Land's End to John O'Groats for a colleague who had testicular cancer. I've been Chair of School Governor's at a local Special Needs School, been a Trustee at a local Donkey Sanctuary – I like to be busy!
